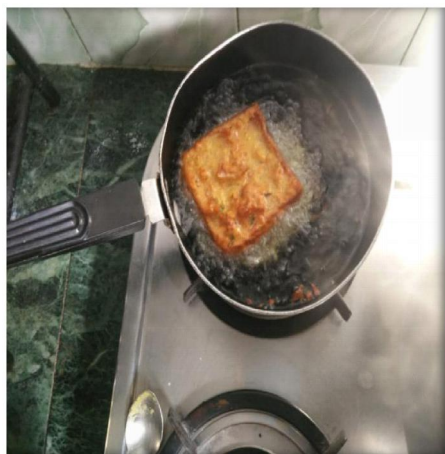

NUTRITION TRAINING

Every third Tuesday of the month nutritional demonstration is held for h.p's on high calorie high protein low cost diet. This month on 16th October demo on nutritional bread Pakora was conducted. Bread Pakora was made innovative, healthy and nutritious by adding grated carrots, cauliflower, spinach, coriander leaves in batter of Besan (Chana daal flour) and dried spices. The bread is coated with the batter and deep fried. Oil and flour helps in adding more calories and protein while vegetables increase Micronutrient level of this famous Indian snack. 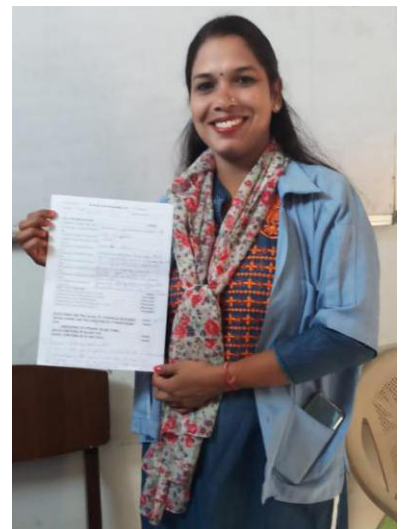

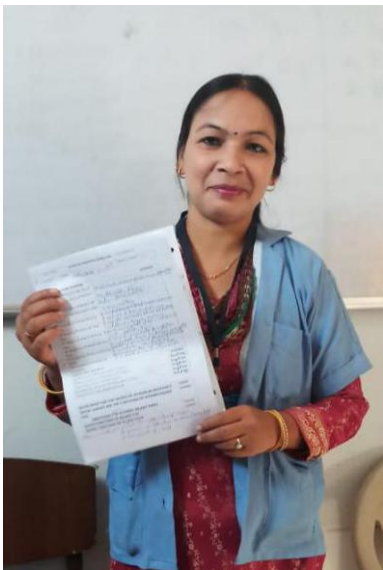

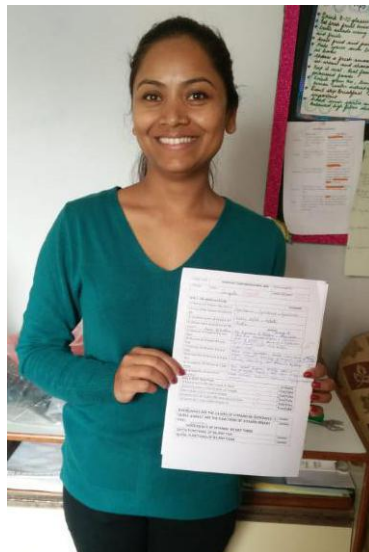
